1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 It is proposed to install an open cell ceiling in the Copeland Centre Atrium. This is currently an area which is very high and open up to the roof level. The staff in the area have been unhappy with certain aspects of the environment and it is believed that this will provide a valuable improvement
- 1.2 Such a ceiling comprises the normal grey metal grid with 24" x 24" tiles that comprise vertical slates at two and a half inches spacings both ways resting on the grid (see Appendix A). This ceiling will lower the visual aspect of the room and provide an appearance relatively similar to the other rooms in the building. As the room is naturally ventilated and lit the open cell construction will allow air and light to move directly upwards and downwards, but the ceiling will improve sound and glare reduction.

- 1.3 The load bearing capacity of the roof has been checked and found to be adequate and prices have been obtained from two contractors for fitting the ceiling. The expected total cost (including out of hours working) is estimated at a maximum of £10,000. Permission is required from London & Regional Properties Ltd, this has been requested and we are awaiting the outcome of their consultation with the Mechanical and Ventilation Specialists. Payment would be to L & R through a variation to the PFI contract.
- 1.4 There are a small number of outstanding issues that remain to be concluded with L & R including elimination of noise created by heavy rain on the roof windows to the atrium, these are being pursued separately, and the installation of the ceiling will have no effect on these other matters.

2. CONCLUSIONS

- 2.1 Members are advised that Budgetary provision exists through the Public Building Fund contingency 2005 6, in the sum of £17,000 as at end of January 2006, and that part of this could now be made available for this purpose.
- 2.2 Executive is asked to approve allocation of £10,000 from the Public Building Fund revenue contingency 2005 6.
