#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In accordance with Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1972 postholders need to be authorised to attend Court and represent the Council in connection with legal proceedings relating to the recovery of unpaid Council Tax and Non-domestic rates.
- 1.2 Currently the same officers are unable to represent the Council in the County Court in connection with legal proceedings relating to the recovery of unpaid miscellaneous income due to the Council.

### 2. ARGUMENT

- 2.1 The authorisation of officers to represent the Council at Magistrates Court was last amended in September 1999, since then the names of posts have been changed and the authorisation needs to reflect these changes.
- 2.2 As part of the restructure the recovery of miscellaneous income is the responsibility of the Customer Services section. It is intended that as part of the recovery process Customer Service

officers will attend County Court in respect of non contested cases. All other cases will be referred to a legal professional.

# 3. CONCLUSIONS

3.1 That Council approval is required to grant authorisation to the relevant officers in order for them to carry out their official duties.
