DEVELOPMENT CONTROL PERFORMANCE MONITORING 2007/08

Resource Implications: Performance in terms of speed of determination of

planning applications and the percentage of planning appeals allowed are reflected in the annual award of

Planning Delivery Grant by Central Government.

1.1 SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1.1 Speed of Determination of Planning Applications – the following results were achieved:-

BVPI 109(a)

Major planning applications dealt 70%

with < 13 weeks (14 out of 20)

Target is 60%

BVPI 109(b)

Minor planning applications dealt 77.59%

with < 8 weeks (135 out of 174)

Target is 65%

BVPI 109(c)

Other planning applications dealt 92%

with < 8 weeks (359 out of 389)

Target is 80%

1.1.1 It can be seen that all three national targets were exceeded last year. Credit for this commendable achievement is largely due to the excellent team effort from all professional, technical and administrative support staff involved in the complex development control process. Timely determination of applications referred to the Planning Panel is also a significant factor, bearing in mind that approximately 30% of all applications are referred to Members for determination under the Council's present scheme of delegation to officers as opposed to the nationally advocated target of 10%.

- 1.2 Percentage of Planning Appeals Allowed 28.57% of planning appeals determined during 2007/08 were allowed (4 out of 14) which slightly exceeds the target figure of 25%.
- 1.3 It is anticipated that the above performance outturns should result in a greater PDG award for development control this year than the £34,401 awarded in 2007/08.
