WHAT BENEFITS WILL THESE PROPOSALS BRING TO COPELAND RESIDENTS

The inclusion of the former bus station and bus depot sites within the Whitehaven Town Centre Conservation Area will ensure that greater weight can be given to the design elements of any future planning proposals for these sites.

WHY HAS THIS REPORT COME TO THE EXECUTIVE?

This report seeks to amend a previous decision by Executive.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the proposed boundary of the Whitehaven Town Centre Conservation Area should include the sites of the former Bus Station and Bus Depot, as illustrated on the attached plan, (to correct an error in the previous drafting of the boundary).

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 At Executive on 10 February 2010 a recommendation to extend and combine two Conservation Areas in Whitehaven Town Centre was agreed. Unfortunately, the plan attached to that report excluded the sites of the former bus station and bus depot. This was as a result of a draughting error, as both of these sites were recommended for inclusion in the revised Conservation Area by consultants, Paul Butler Associates, in their Conservation Area Appraisal which had been previously reported to the Planning Panel (22 July 2009).

2. ARGUMENT

- 2.1 These two sites are considered to be important sites which could make a positive regeneration contribution at this important gateway to the town centre. Their inclusion in the revised Conservation Area will enhance the Council's planning powers in dealing with any future planning applications.
- 2.2 The consultation process on the extension to the Conservation Area included these two sites within the proposed Conservation Area.

3. OPTIONS TO BE CONSIDERED

- 3.1 Conservation Area status will enhance the Council's position in seeking a higher standard of design for new development on these sites.
