PERSONAL AND PREJUDICIAL INTERESTS

If you have a personal interest in a matter you will also have a prejudicial interest in that matter if the interest is one which a member of the public, with knowledge of the relevant facts, would reasonably regard as so significant that it is likely to prejudice your judgement of the public interest. If you have a personal and prejudicial interest you must withdraw from the meeting room for that item, unless you are there to make representations and the public have the same opportunity to do so. NB You **only** have a prejudicial interest if the matter affects your financial position or that of your family, close associate, employer etc or it relates to a regulatory matter

You will also have a prejudicial interest in any business before an overview and scrutiny committee or sub-committee where that business relates to a decision made (whether implemented or not) or action taken by your authorities executive or another of your authority's committees, joint committees or joint sub-committees; and at the time the decision was made or action was taken, you were a member of the executive, committee, subcommittee, joint committee or joint sub-committee mentioned in paragraph (a) above and you were present when that decision was taken.

A personal and prejudicial interest should be declared as follows:

I have a personal and prejudicial interest in agenda item [...] regarding the report on [.....] because I am [.....].
