Summary:	Proposes minor change to the Constitution.
Recommendation:	That the change set out in paragraph 2.3 be agreed and implemented with immediate effect.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 This report recommends a minor amendment to the Constitution which has come to light since the establishment of Committees by Council on the 10th May 2007. The amendment requires approval by full Council.

2. LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

- 2.1 The list of memberships submitted to, and approved by Council at the 2007 Annual Meeting, inadvertently included fixed memberships of the 4 Licensing Sub-Committees. This is inconsistent with the decision of Council on 21 June 2005 and 27th June 2006 to move from fixed memberships to a rota-based membership.
- 2.2 Fixed memberships are inappropriate. If a Sub-Committee member falls ill or is otherwise unable to attend a meeting the whole Sub-Committee cannot sit. If this occurs on the morning of a meeting it is unlikely that an alternative fixed membership Sub-Committee can be found resulting in the meeting being cancelled. Frequently many parties attend Sub-Committee hearings and cancellation can result in wasted costs. Rota memberships allow flexibility and avoid the risk of meetings being cancelled at the last minute.
- 2.3 It is therefore recommended that the membership of each of the Licensing Sub-Committees is taken from the Licensing Committee on a rota basis, subject to availability and eligibility, with reserve membership being from any member of the Licensing Committee, and that any such Sub-Committee for the purpose of hearings before it is deemed to be appointed by the Licensing Committee under section 10 of the Licensing Act 2003 and section 154 of the Gambling Act 2005.
