#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- At their meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> December the Executive agreed to the following: 1.1
  - to sell their share in Cumbria Inward Investment Agency (CIIA) back to Cumbria County a. Council
  - that the Council make a contribution to the new organisation of £20,000 for an initial 12 b. month period,
  - that (a) and (b) are subject to Cumbria County Council agreeing to offer the Council on C. seat on the Board.

# 2. ARGUMENT

2.1 At their meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2006 the newly formed Board of Cumbria Inward Investment Agency decided to offer a seat on the Board to Copeland Borough Council, subject to payment of the agreed contribution.

# 3. OPTIONS TO BE CONSIDERED

3.1 The Council now needs to nominate a representative to attend Board meetings on CIIA. The Board comprises nine members and no substitutes are allowed to attend meetings.

### 4. CONCLUSIONS

- 4.1 Through its place on the Board of CIIA, the Council will be able to influence the policies of the Agency to ensure that Copeland remains a key location for inward investment projects within Cumbria.
- 4.2 It is widely recognised that nuclear decommissioning will provide future opportunities to attract inward investment projects from within the UK and abroad in the future.
