Summary and Recommendation:

This report advises the Executive of action taken under the Urgent Action Procedure to expedite arrangements for financial assistance to Whitehaven RLFC.

1. INTRODUCTION

The opportunity for kick-starting the Pow Beck Valley regeneration programme is time sensitive to payments being made to Whitehaven Rugby League Football Club by the end of the week beginning 10th March (this week). The West Cumbria Development Fund have agreed to loan £75k (Seventy Five thousand Pounds) to Whitehaven RLFC through the Council for a 3 year period. The Council has in turn agreed to underwrite the loan.

While the Executive took the decision on Tuesday this week, the decision is still subject to OSC call-in for a period of 7 clear working days (non-inclusive), thereby going beyond the critical payment period.

Urgent action is needed to agree with the relevant OSC Chairs Management Committee & Economic Development & Enterprise to curtail the OSC call-in period so that the relevant payments can be made in time. This has been agreed by the Members concerned and is reported to Executive in accordance with the requirements of the constitution
