1. INTRODUCTION

Background Papers:

1.1 The Report of the IDeA peer review team following the ethical governance light touch health check visit in November has been received and circulated to all members of the Standards Committee.

2 SUMMARY OF ISSUES

- 2.1 The peer review report contains many positive messages about the ethical governance agenda at the Council but also raises some concerns in a number of areas. These relate mainly to the need to raise the profile of ethical governance and of the Standards Committee itself within the organisation and establishing clearer links between the Standards Committee and other parts of the Council's governance arrangements, particularly between the Chair of the Committee and the Leader, Chief Executive and full Council.
- 2.2 Following discussions with the Chair, the Deputy Leader, the Chief Executive and the Monitoring Officer, a work plan has been prepared which attempts to build in the main issues raised by the peer review report. The draft work plan is attached as Appendix "A". It also reflects the need for the Committee to be prepared in both skills and capacity for the new locally based ethical governance regime, which is addressed in more detail in a separate report on this agenda.
