Summary and Recommendation:

The Executive agree to use reserves to cover costs connected with presenting a business case for the future of the Revenues and Benefits service.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Executive have agreed the Project Initiation Document to review the future delivery of the Revenues and Benefits Service. In this document it stated that the Council's share of meeting the costs of producing the business case, mainly to resource the expert assistance needed, will be in the region of £25,000.

1.2 This report identifies a source of funding for this and requests Executive approval.

2. ARGUMENT

2.1 There will be a requirement to fund some expenditure attached to the delivery of the work packages. An example of some of the expenditure will be to run external workshops and consultation, as well as recruit suitable ecternal resourcces to take the lead on the work packages where we have insufficient internal resources.

2.3 Each of the 3 Local Authorities involved (Allerdale, Carlisle and Copeland) have agreed to a maximum of £25k and any underspend will be returned to reserves.

3. OPTIONS TO BE CONSIDERED

3.1 The expenditure can be covered by either the underspend on salaries due to the vacancies within Revenues and Benefits or

3.2 by a grant from DWP which is currently in earmarked reserves.

4. CONCLUSIONS

4.1 The earmarked reserve is for \pounds 41k. If \pounds 25k is utilised for this project there will still be \pounds 16k to cover any additional expenditure against the DWP grant which will be sufficient for the anticipated costs.

5. FINANCIAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS (INCLUDING SOURCES OF FINANCE)

5.1 Need to release £25k from earmarked reserves.
