IT Strategy

Members considered a template for an IT Strategy specifically designed for local authorities. This would be a big change, not just for the IT section but for all services given the greater involvement of business managers, who would need to make a business case for projects and become actively involved. The strategy itself was relatively easy-to-understand, all management aspects, national targets were covered. There was a need to Copeland-ise the document and put a formal case together as to why there was a need to do it. It was also pointed out that the need for a strategy was an outstanding audit action point.

Members present agreed:

- That they were very happy with the proposal, but they would like to see a summary to the document during the 'Copeland-ising' to make for easier reading.
- They would like to have the opportunity to comment on the draft Copeland strategy, expected by the end of March.
- They would like to see a plan, setting out the timetable for the implementation of the strategy.
- They would like thought given to how the strategy is promoted to Members in addition to staff.
