Summary: To consider a draft final report from the Economic Regeneration Best Value Review.

Recommendation: The OSC is asked to note the Action Plan and Priorities within it.

Impact on delivering Copeland 2020 objectives: The operation and activities of the Councils Economic Regeneration activities are critical to the delivery of key corporate objectives. Economic Regeneration is a stated high priority for the Council. Creating a healthy economy is one of the key themes in the corporate plan agreed with partners.

Impact on other statutory objectives (e.g. crime & disorder, LA21): The impact of potential economic change on law and disorder and the environment is very significant

Financial and human resource implications: Actions that have already been implemented arising from the first phase of the review have had an impact on resources and these have already been funded. A major element in the plan will be the West Cumbria masterplan which is fully externally funded.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Council has been carrying out a Best Value Review of Economic Regeneration under the auspices of a Steering Group chaired by Councillor Connolly. OSC's views on the report and particularly the Action Plan and priorities within it are sought.
- 1.2 The summary report attached is backed up by full documentation of the process and background files for internal use on the Best Value F Drive on the Council's intranet.

2. Key Issues

- 2.1 The review has been carried out over an extended period of time due to the effects of Council restructuring on the capacity of the service to carry out the review. As a consequence, significant progress in implementation of actions on the ground has already been undertaken and these are described in Section Three.
- 2.2 During the period of the review West Cumbria partners have jointly agreed to carry out a major review and master planning exercise of the area. This work will challenge current thinking and strategy, produce a new strategy and action plan, short and long term programmes, funding plans and identify what will need to change organisationally and procedurally to ensure effective delivery. As it is inappropriate for the action plan from this review to instigate anything that will duplicate this process, a number of pieces of work arising have been written into the brief for the masterplan.
- 2.3 Members are asked to consider there is anything they feel that should be changed in the action plan (Section 4) that can be supported by the work that has preceded it
