1. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1.1 The North West Innovation Fund for Elected Members is funded by the North West Improvement and Efficiency Partnership (NWIEP) through the NWEO Gateway and is open to all elected Members in the North West.

2. PROPOSALS

- 2.1 £50,000 of funding is available with a maximum of £5,000 for any single application.
- 2.2 The Innovation Fund is designed to support individual elected Members to undertake a range of activities within their own authorities to improve services and knowledge through shared learning. Innovation and risk taking is being encouraged and the range activities that will be eligible is therefore not being prescribed. As a guide, applications could be for:

Academic Study

Research Projects

Community-based initiatives that involve shared learning

Study Visits, locally or nationally

2.3 Applications are unlikely to be supported for activities that are usually funded by the Council such as conferences or training events, or for party political activities. Successful applications will need to demonstrate added value to Council development programmes. Learning from the Fund will be expected to be shared within the Region through the NWEO Gateway and NWIEP. Additional methods of information sharing could be:

Providing masterclasses or presentations

Production of web-based materials

Reports or briefing notes

2.4 Applications are by application form and will be assessed by scoring on the following criteria, by a selection panel of four elected Members:

Outcomes and Benefits

Funding – Cost Effectiveness and VFM

Partnership Evidence
Communication and Dissemination
Milestones and Project Planning
Governance of Project
Evaluating Impacts
