Summary and Recommendation:

One of the actions arising from the Audit Commission Report was to 'Develop a new Private Sector Housing Strategy'.

The Private Sector Housing Strategy has now been written, out to consultation and amended following comments received after consultation. The Strategic Housing Panel agreed on 10 February 2010 that the Strategy be recommended to Executive for approval.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Audit Commission recommended that a private sector housing strategy was developed.

2 Process

- 2.1 The private sector housing strategy was written during 2009 and sent out for consultation in September 2009. Consultation closed in November 2009.
- 2.2 Comments were received from corporate team; Egremont Town Council; Millom Town Council; Lamplugh Parish Council and the Lake District National Park Authority.
- 2.3 Comments have been incorporated into the attached final version of the strategy.
- 2.4 During the recent visist from the Audit Commission a comment was made that the targets within the action plan were inadequate. The Action plan was re written and presented to the Strategic Housing Panel in January for approval, this has now been incorporated within the document attached.

3 Monitoring

- 3.1 The targets will be monitored by the Strategic Housing Panel, a report will be brought to the panel with updates on each target on a quarterly basis commencing May 2010.
- 3.2 The revised action plan gives us targets to produce an empty homes strategy and enforcement toolkit within the next few months. All of these will be presented to the Strategic Housing Panel.
