Low and Very Low Level Radioactive Waste Disposal

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Summary and Recommendation:

Executive are asked to consider and support the recommendation from the Nuclear Working Group on 30 July 2009. Namely that, The Executive seek the agreement of the NDA and the Department of Energy and Climate Change to the approach in 2.1.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Nuclear Working Group at its meeting on 30 July 2009 discussed the issues around the disposal of low and very low level radioactive waste.

2. ARGUMENT

- 2.1 There are very large volumes of low and very low level radioactive wastes that will be arising from the decommissioning of the Sellafield site. There will be a strong desire from the industry that these materials should not be transported far from Sellafield for disposal. This creates the potential for a piecemeal and opportunistic approach to siting repositories for lower level wastes which will undermine the proper planning of the area and may lead to increasingly negative perceptions of environmental quality throughout Copeland and West Cumbria.
- 2.2 The Nuclear Working Group believe that any proposals to dispose of low and very low level radioactive waste in West Cumbria, outside of the current Low Level Waste Repository and existing facilities on the Sellafield site should be withdrawn until a strategic plan for siting such facilities is agreed with the Copeland Borough Council and Cumbria County Council. The development of such a plan should be subject to full public and stakeholder engagement.

3. CONCLUSIONS

3.1 The Nuclear Working Group recommended that the Executive seek the agreement of the NDA and the Department of Energy and Climate

Change to the approach agreed in their meeting on 30 July 2009 as detailed in 2.1 above.

5. FINANCIAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS (INCLUDING SOURCES OF FINANCE)

5.1 There are no additional financial and human resource implications. Existing resources are in place to receive and respond to a strategic siting plan from Sellafield.
