The Environment Agency has published a <u>report</u> scrutinising the NDA's work on geological disposal in 2008/09 and outlines the Agency's plans for 2009/10.

## **Other News**

A Blue Ribbon Commission has been established to provide recommendations for developing a safe, long-term solution for managing the USA's spent nuclear fuel and nuclear waste. To read more about the Commissions composition and remit click <u>here</u>.

The <u>final summary report</u> for the ARGONA project has now been published. The project investigated how approaches of transparency and deliberation relate to each other and to the political system in which decisions, for example on the final disposal of nuclear waste, are ultimately taken. The project also studied how good risk communication could be undertaken and the conduct of public consultations.

## Consultations

The Scottish Government is consulting on its proposed policy for managing Higher Activity Waste (HAW). The consultation document can be viewed <u>here</u> and closes on 9 April, 2010. The proposed policy is to support long term near surface, near site storage and disposal facilities so that the waste is monitorable and retrievable and the need for transporting it over long distances is minimal.

As the proposed policy could have some implications for waste management in England and Wales, the NuLeAF Steering Group has agreed to submit comments (see the <u>report</u> presented to the Steering Group at its meeting on 27 January, 2010). One of the key issues is the lack of discussion about the sort of strategy that might be used to site near surface disposal facilities.

#### **NDA News**

NDA has published their Business Plan 2010-13. More information and a copy of the full Business Plan can be found on their <u>website</u>. NDA has also published a discussion paper on developing a strategy for the management of spent oxide fuels. The paper can be viewed on their website <u>here</u> and details are also given of how to comment. The final version of the UK Strategy for Low Level Radioactive Waste will be published shortly.

The second issue of NDA's newsletter <u>'Insight'</u> has been published. It includes: an update from the NDA CE, Tony Fountain, an article on the return of high level waste to overseas customers and a round up of what's happening at individual sites.

## CoRWM

CoRWM has submitted its comments on the draft National Policy Statements for Energy Infrastructure. You can read them <u>here</u>.

They have also published a <u>statement</u> on their position with regard to new nuclear build wastes.

The Committee's <u>draft response</u> to the Scottish Government consultation on Higher Activity Wastes is being discussed at their plenary meeting on 22-23 March.

#### New on NuLeAF's website

The overview of proposed LLW disposal facilities in Cumbria, Lancashire and Northamptonshire has been updated to reflect the outcome of the Northamptonshire Development Control Committee meeting and other developments. The proposal for the disposal of NORM (naturally occurring radioactive materials) at the Stoneyhill landfill site near Peterhead has also been included (overview of LLW developments). #### Consultations

The Scottish Government is consulting on its proposed policy for managing Higher Activity Waste (HAW). The consultation document can be viewed <u>here</u> and closes on 9 April, 2010. NuLeAF has submitted a response which can be viewed <u>our website</u>.

DECC has launched consultations on <u>financing arrangements for nuclear decommissioning and</u> <u>waste handling regulations</u> and on a <u>methodology for determining a fixed unit price for waste</u> <u>disposal and updated cost estimates for nuclear decommissioning waste management and waste</u> <u>disposal</u>. Both consultations end on 18 June, 2010. These consultations will be considered by the Steering Group at its meeting on 20 April.

A consultation on <u>planning obligations</u> has been published by DCLG. The closing date is 21 June.

#### **Other News**

The House of Commons Energy and Climate Change Committee has published its <u>report</u> on the proposals for the national policy statements on energy.

DCLG has published an <u>overview</u> and <u>guidance</u> on charge setting and charge scheduling procedures for the Community Infrastructure Levy.
