Dates for your diary

The next **Steering Group** meeting will be held on 25 January, 2011 at Local Government House, Smith Square, London, 11.00 – 3.00. The Nuclear Industry Association will give the afternoon presentation on the findings of their recent study into management options for spent fuel from new nuclear power stations. There will be an opportunity for discussion following the presentation.

NDA News

- Berkeley has become the first site in the UK to put its reactors in to <u>SafeStore</u>
- NDA launched the consultation on it's draft <u>Business Plan</u> on 1 December. The consultation closes on 26 January, 2011. NuLeAF's response will be considered at the Steering Group meeting on 25 January, 2011.

- <u>Wylfa</u> and <u>Trawsfynydd</u> have both published the first edition of their new respective quarterly newsletters.
- RSRL have published site project up-dates for both Harwell and Winfrith.
- Sellafield Ltd has signed an important <u>recycling contract</u> which will save disposal space at the Low Level Waste Repository.

West Cumbria MRWS Partnership

The Partnership has been running a second phase of public and stakeholder engagement, including a series of drop-in sessions for members of the public to find out more about the GDF siting process and to express their views. The Government is re-consulting on the draft <u>Nuclear National Policy Statement (NPS)</u>. The consultation closes on 24 January 2011. NuLeAF's response on the radioactive waste management aspects will be posted on its website in the New Year.

Consultations are also being run on <u>Consultation on revised Funded Decommissioning Programme Guidance</u>, <u>Consultation on a Waste Transfer Pricing Methodology</u> and <u>Strategy for the management of Solid Low Level Radioactive Waste from the Non-Nuclear Industry</u>. All these consultations close on 8 March, 2011 and NuLeAF draft responses will be considered at the Steering Group on 25 January, 2011.
