Summary and Recommendation: To receive and consider a petition from Bransty School Council concerning dog fouling around the school. This item was deferred from the committee's meeting on 2 August 2010.

1. Background

1.1 A petition has been received from Bransty School Council bearing 95 signatures. The petition says:

"The School Council is becoming increasingly concerned about the dog fouling on the way to and around school. The School Council became more aware of this issue on Friday 19 March when they completed their mile walk in aid of Sport Relief. They believe we need to highlight this health and safety and environmental issue to the local council."

2. Petition Scheme

2.1 The Council's recently introduced Petitions Scheme says that in the vast majority of cases petitions received which relate to the Council's responsibilities will be reported to a formal meeting to be considered by members. The subject matter of this petition falls within the terms of reference of this Committee. The Scheme provides for the petition organizer to attend and briefly address the relevant meeting on the subject matter of the petition. Representatives of the Bransty School Council have been invited to this meeting though no response had been received at the time of writing.

3. Petition

3.1 The Enforcement Manager has been consulted on the concerns raised by the petitioners, and reports that no complaints have been received from the school, but we have asked them to be more specific about particular locations which are of concern. There may be more positive measures which the Council

can introduce to help address the concerns of the petitioners which the Enforcement Manager will explain at the meeting.

4. Conclusion

4.1 The Committee is asked to consider whether it wishes to recommend any specific measures in response to the petition at this stage. Members may prefer to defer the matter to the September meeting when it may be more convenient for representatives of the School Council to attend.
