- This report updates Members on current planning enforcement issues 1.1 and follows a similar report presented at the 15th September 2010 Planning Panel meeting.
- From September 1st 2010 to December 31st 2010 the Council have 1.2 received 63 complaints regarding alleged breaches of Planning Control, in addition to the 93 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control that were unresolved previously
