1.0 Supporting Information:

- 1.1 This report updates Members on current planning enforcement issues and follows a similar report presented at the 31st March 2010 Planning Panel meeting.
- 1.2 From March 2010 to August 2010 the Council have received 138 complaints regarding alleged breaches of Planning Control, in addition to the 35 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control that were unresolved during the previous six months.
