1.0 Supporting Information:

- 1.1 This report updates Members on current planning enforcement issues and follows a similar report presented at the 04th January 2012 Planning Panel meeting.
- 1.2 From December 1st 2011 to June 30th 2012 the Council have received 129 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control, in addition to the 149 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control that were unresolved previously
- 1.3 The complaints can be broken down as follows:-

1.8 Below is a breakdown of ongoing prosecutions for breaches of planning control:

Non compliance with Advertisement Consent Regulations 3

- 1.9 Since August 2009 the Council have received 667 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control, and 523 have been successfully resolved.
- 2.1 The Council have received numerous retrospective planning applications since August 2009 that have resulted from enforcement action. To date this has generated £25,338 of income by way of planning application fees.

 Enforcement action from December 1st 2011 to June 30th 2012 has generated £7,598 by way of planning application fees
- 2.2 A visual presentation of examples of planning enforcement cases will be provided at the meeting.
- 2.3 Feedback from Members would be welcomed.
