1.0 **Supporting Information:**

- This report updates Members on current planning enforcement issues 1.1 and follows a similar report presented at the 2nd February 2011 Planning Panel meeting.
- From January 1st 2011 to June 30th 2011 the Council have received 1.2 114 complaints regarding alleged breaches of Planning Control, in addition to the 88 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control that were unresolved previously
