Effective Standards Committees

Part 2 - Part 2 involves facilitated group work

Groups are asked to consider three or four scenarios: the apathetic authority, the struggling authority, the engaged authority and (if appropriate) parish council problems. They will discuss and evaluate a number of suggested initiatives for each authority and assess the barriers and success factors in each scenario.

Following a short plenary discussion, delegates will be invited to prepare action plans for their own authorities.
