Having met the family who require the provision of the settlement site, at Weddicar Parish Council meeting, I wish to question if the provision is actually required. Having met [REDACTED] it became apparent he holds a permanent employment at Sellafield. He has also mentioned that he wishes to live where they can integrate in to the community so that the children can integrate, as they likely will not continue their way of life and will choose not to live in caravans. By the definition provided on page 17/18 of the Gypsy Traveller Accommodation Assessment, taken from the PPST 2015, it suggests a gypsy/traveller should travel for the purpose of their livelihood. I do not believe that to be the case in this instance. From what I know I believe the family travel to a permanent job from a permanent residence and as such as stated in APP/E2205/C/15/3137477 should not be classed as a gypsy/traveller under the definition for provision of a permanent settlement. *Hearne v National Assembly for Wales (1999)* may also be relevant as the circumstances appear similar. I appreciate there is there is the option that they can 'provide information' which explains why they cease to travel for their livelihood and how they will continue to do so at some point, as travelling for livelihood is in abeyance rather than being abandoned. This could be the case and would therefore be more similar circumstance to *R v Shropshire CC ex p Bungay (1990)*. However I would ask that it is checked that they do in fact meet the criteria for provision and if they have claimed they have temporarily ceased to travel for their livelihood, for education or ill-health within the family, that it is checked that they have in fact 'provided information' as to their previous travelling for their livelihood and their future plans to travel for their livelihood, as would be required. I find it hard to believe that a well paid job at Sellafield would be abandoned. I would ask that consideration be given to APP/J1915/W/16/3145267 and APP/V2635/W/17/3180533 and that it is satisfied that in this circumstance it is not the case that the family are still travelling for economic purposes, but that the travelling amounts to a short time only and the income is small especially in comparison to their main income from their permanent work. The case law and appeals mentioned above are taken from the Gypsy Traveller Accommodation Assessment pg 18/19.

By putting the site there, surely an unsafe junction would be created with large vehicles (caravans, motor homes) being manoeuvred into the tight corner. Aswell as this, putting a gypsy/traveller site as close to housing as this site (GTW3) is, you are decreasing home values, putting property at risk and even creating disturbances among residents and gypsies that do not need to happen. But by putting the site on GTW5a, away from housing, you are fixing this issue whilst still giving gypsies and travellers somewhere to stay.

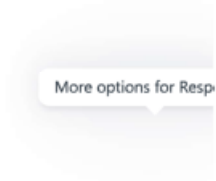

1/ To be Proportionate and Fair to all, the geographical area chosen by CBC for a potential Gypsy and Travellers site assessments must cover a greater percentage of Copeland.

2/ CBC has put nine sites forward for assessment that didn't meet their own criteria, the majority of these nine sites were undersized and totally inappropriate, it is ridiculous these sites should have been put forward?

3/ CBC Strategic Planning have omitted to share one of the preferred sites GTW5 has a Grade 11 listed building with 300 metres of the site and a Victorian Guesthouse 190 metres from the site. this must be included in the assessment to be sound and fair.

Please see further note I would like taken into account in for my objection to a potential Gypsy and Travellers site at location GTW5.

1. Loss of a signed foot path from Homewood road towards Sneckyeat lane.
2. Loss of wild green space for children who play free in this area during the summer months within close proximity and safety of their homes, essential to develop their character and imagination in a wild outside area full of biodiversity.
3. Loss of a wild green space where local residents can walk their pets, some well-behaved pets during their walk can roam free safe from traffic and no danger to agricultural livestock. To lose this area would be especially sad for our elderly residents unable to take their pets on longer walks, some of which their pets are the only family they have.
4. The Hensingham site has been deemed inappropriate for residents allotments due to contamination as a result of infill after being a past quarry, current drainage issues are still ongoing.
5. Government advice for Gypsy and Travellers sites, Location/selection of permanent sites is quite clear and states 'Sites should not be identified for Gypsy and Traveller use in locations that are inappropriate for ordinary residential dwellings, unless exceptional circumstances apply'
6. West Cumberland Hospital is within a couple of hundred meters of the proposed site, WCH requires clear entry and exit for emergency vehicles, it has been suggested towing of caravans by vehicle or horses could impact on the emergency vehicles.
7. No information regarding what a Gypsy site entails, just our speculation has made residents negative and frightened.
8. Access to the proposed GTW5 site is via Sneckyeat road, a narrow lane, laid partly in tarmac and rough stone, currently used by pedestrians and single line vehicle parking, currently this would not be wide enough for the Towing of caravans.
9. The current Copeland infrastructure ie poor roads, pavements, social housing, schools, amenities, GP and Hospital appointments/treatments, lack of purposeful policing, low employment, and the current financial increases on all households, contributing to massive increases in the need of food banks are all issues that leave Copeland residents in despair. And now are informed CBC will be financing the building a Gypsy and Traveller site to house people who are currently living in locally in either their own Bricks and mortar properties or social housing.

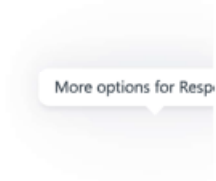
