1.0 Supporting Information:

- 1.1 This report updates Members on current planning enforcement issues and follows a similar report presented on the 18th July 2012 Planning Panel meeting.
- 1.2 From the 1st July 2012 to December 31st 2012 the Council have received 147 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control, in addition to the 144 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control that were unresolved previously
- 1.3 The complaints can be broken down as follows:-

- 1.9 Two offenders were prosecuted in the second half 2012 for breaches of planning control. A company pleaded guilty to displaying advertisements without the benefit of consent. A Homeowner was found guilty for not complying with an Enforcement Notice after a Magistrates hearing.
- 2.0 Since August 2009 the Council have received 814 complaints regarding alleged breaches of planning control, and 659 have been successfully resolved.
- 2.1 The Council have received numerous retrospective planning applications since August 2009 that have resulted from enforcement action. To date this has generated £30,357 of income by way of planning application fees. Enforcement action from July 1st 2012 to December 31st 2012 has generated £5,019 by way of planning application fees
- 2.2 A visual presentation of recent examples of breaches of advertisement control and untidy sites will be presented at the meeting.
- 2.3 Feedback from Members would be welcomed.
