



LANDSCAPING KEY

NATIVE TREES

Typical species to include: Betula pendula (BP), Prunus padus (PP),
Quercus robur (QR), Sorbus acuparia (SA), Castanea sativa (CS) and
Tilia cordata (TC) in girth sizes 14-16 cm to 8-10cm girth. All trees to be planted with one tree stake and soft tree tie. Understorey planting typically to include: Corylus Avellana (CA),
Crataegus Monogyna and Ilex Aquiforlium (IA) in girth sizes 8-10cm

Typical species to include: Azalea louisa, Berberis thunbergii 'rose glow', Cornus alba, Cytisus x Kewensis, Cytisus sorparius 'Cornish queen', Euonymus Sanguin 'Silver Queen', Geranium x riversleaianum, Geranium Sanguine var. Striatum, Hebe ' Midsummer Beauty' Potentilla Abbotswood', Pontilla 'Red Ace'

Stipa calamagrostis or tenissima. Planting density 3 - 4 plants per m². **NEW BOUNDARY HEDGE** Native hederow planting to include Hazel, Hawthorn, Holly, blackthorn and Beech. in double rows of min. 6 plants per linear meter. Planting rows to be staggered.

Rhododendron 'Percy Wiseman', Rhododendron ' Baden baden' and

Typically to include native daffodils, native bluebells and native snowdrops. Planting should be in random clusters of approx. 5 bulbs per m<sup>2</sup>. All bulbs must be planted the right way up and a min. depth of 3 times the bulb size.

TREE PLANTING


All new planting to favour native trees and shrubs particularly species that produce flowers, berries or seeds to provide habitat replacement value for local wildlife -see separate planting schedule for species and Timber post and rail fencing to be erected around all new planting area.


All material are to be supplied, handled and planted in accordance with all best practices and current British Standards / Guidelines.

Care to be taken in respect of planting near walls and retaining structures and distance guidelines as detailed in British Standard 5837 Trees in relation to construction - Recommendations Table 3 should be adhered to.
