## 7. Report:

## **Site and Location**

Sellafield is an existing licensed nuclear site situated on the west coast of Cumbria. It is highly industrialised covering an area of approximately 6km square and accommodating over 1300 buildings of varying sizes. Vehicular access is via the A595T at Blackbeck, Calderbridge and Seascale.

Whilst the site does not benefit from any sensitive designations it is situated circa 3km away from the boundary of the Lake District National Park to the east which is a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The application site lies within eastern quadrant of the Sellafield site.

## The Proposal

The applicant, Sellafield Ltd, operate a number of processes on the Sellafield Licensed nuclear site which involve the storage and use of hazardous substances.

Express consent is sought under the Planning (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2015 (as amended by the Planning (Hazardous Substances) (Amendment) 2017) to relocate/ diesel fuel already stored on the Sellafield site into new tanks which were commissioned in association with the CHP Plant at Fellside. This is one of two applications currently pending for Hazardous Substances Consent (HSC) approval in relation to the site.

Diesel has been stored and used on the site for many years, there will be minimal change to the quantities involved with the proposal being to relocate it into the new storage facilities.

It is the role of the Local Planning Authority in such instances to assess the degree of risk the relocation, storage and use of this substance poses to the surrounding community. The system is designed to ensure such a substance can be stored and used in significant amounts on the Sellafield site without posing a major off site risk to the public/ local community.

## **Relevant Planning History**

The new tanks which the diesel is to be relocated into were approved as part of the development associated with the Steam Generation Plant (SGP) (planning references 4/17/2256/0F1 and 4/20/2044/OF1 refer). The relocation of the substance per se does not in itself constitute development under the planning legislation.

## Assessment/ Conclusion.

Taking into account the above and in particular the consultation response from HSE, it is considered that the safety risks to the surrounding community arising from the proposed relocation of the diesel fuel into new storage facilities on the Sellafield licensed nuclear site are minimal and as such the proposal is considered acceptable in compliance with the Planning (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2015 as amended. Also it should be noted that the proposal raises no material planning issues and generally accords with the policies of the Copeland Local Plan and national guidance contained in the NPPF.

**Approve Hazardous Substances** 

#### 9. Conditions:

The hazardous substance shall not be kept or used and other than in accordance with the
particulars provided on the application form (incorporating `revised Table A` received by
the Local Planning Authority on 8 July 2021) nor outside the areas marked for storage of
the substance on the plans which formed part of the application; Substance Location Plan
and the Location of Fellside CHP New Oil Tanks.

Reason

To ensure the safety of the hazardous substances specified in the Consent.

2. The hazardous substance part 2 -34 (c) gas oils [also substance 34 (e) alternative fuels with the same properties as substance 34 (c)] shall have a flash point greater than 60 degrees centigrade and, shall not be classified under European Regulation (EC) No 1271/2008 (the CLP Regulations) as Flammable Liquid category 1 or category 2 or category 3; and shall only be kept at ambient temperature and pressure.

Reason

To ensure the safety of the hazardous substances specified in the Consent.

#### Statement

The Local Planning Authority has acted positively and proactively in determining this application by assessing the proposal against all material considerations and any representations that may have been received and subsequently determining to grant Hazardous Substances Consent in accordance with the Planning (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2015 as amended and the guidance contained in the National Planning Policy Framework.
