Dear Mr Cottier,

RE: T1. ASH, TREE HAS ASH DIEBACK AND A HEAVY LEAN OVER THE NEIGHBOURING PROPERTY. PROPOSE DISMANTLING TO LEAVE A STANDING STEM AT APPROXIMATELY 4 METRES FOR HABITAT. WOULD NOT SUGGEST REPLANTING AS THE TREE IS POSITIONED IN WOODLAND GROWING VERY CLOSE TO OTHER TREES. T2. ASH, TREE HAS ASH DIEBACK. PROPOSE PRUNING 3 LATERAL BRANCHES THAT ENCROACH OVER NEIGHBOURING PROPERTY BACK TO THE MAIN STEM AS THERE ARE NO SUITABLE PRUNING POINTS INSIDE THE OWNERS BOUNDARY.

I refer to your application of the 11<sup>th</sup> April 2025 under the above Tree Preservation Order for consent to carry out the following work:-

## **DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL**

APPLICATION TREE NO.	SPECIES	PROPOSED WORKS
T1 & T2	2X Ash	T1. Ash, tree has Ash Dieback and a heavy lean over the neighbouring property. Propose dismantling to leave a standing stem at approximately 4 metres for habitat. Would not suggest replanting as the tree is positioned in woodland growing very close to other trees.  T2. Ash, tree has Ash Dieback. Propose pruning 3 lateral branches that encroach over neighbouring property back to the main stem as there are no suitable pruning points inside the owner's boundary.

## **DISCUSSION**

The two ash trees are in the mature age class and show signs of Ash Dieback disease (<a href="https://www.forestresearch.gov.uk/tools-and-resources/fthr/pest-and-disease-resources/ash-dieback-hymenoscyphus-fraxineus/">https://www.forestresearch.gov.uk/tools-and-resources/fthr/pest-and-disease-resources/ash-dieback-hymenoscyphus-fraxineus/</a>).

We expect these two trees will last for less than 10 years.

The trees overhang the neighbouring property and branch, or trunk failure could cause damage or harm.

The trees are protected by Tree Preservation Order TPO 13 (1952).

A TEMPO assessment has been undertaken which shows that a TPO is indefensible due to the poor health and reduced life expectancy of these trees.

# **Decision**

I would confirm that there are no objections to the proposed works as detailed within the application.

# Your Right of Appeal
