**FELLING OF A CHERRY TREE SITUATED WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA
16 FOXHOUSES ROAD, WHITEHAVEN**

I refer to your application of the 15th July 2025 under the above Tree Preservation Order for consent to carry out the following work:-

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL

APPLICATION TREE NO.	SPECIES	PROPOSED WORKS
T1	Conifer	Felling of a conifer tree situated within a Conservation Area.
REASON		
'T1, propose to fell a none native conifer growing from Crow Park Wood with a lean of approximately 25 degrees from vertical so almost the entire crown is over the neighbouring property of 12 Clitheroe Drive caused by suppression from mature tree canopy in the wood. This growth habit is causing nuisance to the residents.'		

Decision

I would confirm that there are no objections to the proposed works as detailed within the application which are considered to be reasonable to prevent the tree causing a damage.

Your Right of Appeal
