**REMOVAL OF TREE (T1) SITUATED WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA
HILLCREST, INKERMANS TERRACE, WHITEHAVEN**

T01	1x Goat Willow	Removal of tree (T1) situated within a Conservation Area.	'T01: Salix caprea (Goat Willow) Mature specimen of around 10m height previously pruned on several occasions. remove due to growth from wall sides area and damage to pathway. Multiple unions at height of coppard represents likely point of failure due to breakability of species and specimen size.'

Decision

I would confirm that there are no objections to the proposed works as detailed within the application which are considered to be reasonable to prevent the tree causing nuisance.
