7. Report:

SITE AND LOCATION

The hedgerow forms part of a larger section of hedgerow adjacent to the highway on land to the north of Spunham Farm. It is located within the countryside. It is adjacent to farmland and is close to the access point for works to the overhead powerlines.

PROPOSAL

Removal of less than 6m of hedgerow is sought to facilitate the entry of plant required to carry out essential refurbishment work upon the steel tower structures which form the AF Route 132kV overhead powerline. Condition based assessments upon the AF053 tower have determined that the structure is at the end of its functional life and in need of urgent upgrading. Currently an existing 10ft gate provides access into agricultural grounds, with a further 12ft gate proposed to increase this to a double gated entrance

PLANNING ASSESSMENT

Prior to the removal of a hedgerow, The LPA must assess the importance of the hedgerow using criteria set out in the regulations.

Under the Hedgerow Regulations 1997, a hedgerow is 'important' if it:

- a) has existed for 30 years or more; and
- b) satisfies at least one of the criteria listed in Part II of Schedule 1 of the Regulations Part II of Schedule 1 separates the criteria in into two sections:
- Archaeology and history; and
- Wildlife and landscape.

The hedgerow has been assessed by the Tree Officer.

Following the criteria detailed in the landscape section of the Hedgerow Regulations 1997, the hedgerow, totalling 6m, specified in the application does not fulfil the criteria of an 'important' hedgerow.

The Hedgerow is also not considered to have any historic or archaeological importance

8. **Recommendation:**

Approve Hedgerow Removal

1. The development hereby permitted shall be commenced before the expiration of two years from the date of this permission.
