7.	Report: Site and Location: The Application Site extends to c.1ha and comprises an existing car park located to the east of Preston Street, Whitehaven and a parcel of currently vacant land located to the rear of Nos. 1-4 and the Former Annlea House (No. 10) The Ginns, Whitehaven. The existing car park is currently operated as a pay and display car park. The Application Site is located c.275m south and c.200m west of the defined Whitehaven Town Centre. The Application Site is irregular in shape and is broadly orientated north south. The Application Site is enclosed by a combination of rubble stone walls, fencing, brick walls and vegetation. The eastern and southern boundaries of the currently vacant land have no physical delineation.	

The Application Site is bounded to the north by an existing footway / Cycle Route 72 beyond which are retail units with associated parking, including an existing ALDI foodstore; to the west by Preston Street and existing dwellings beyond which is an existing ASDA foodstore and commercial development; and, to the east and south by further currently vacant land.

The Application Site is not located within a conservation area .

There are no listed buildings on or directly adjacent to the Application Site.

The Application Site is located in Flood Zone 1, which is the lowest category of flood risk.

The Application Site is partially located within an area identified as having high risk in relation to coal mining.

The Application Site is located within an area identified as potentially contaminated land.

United Utilities assets are located within the Application Site.

Proposal:

This Application seeks approval of details reserved by Planning Condition 7 of planning permission reference 4/23/2314/0F1.

Ground Conditions 7

No above ground development shall commence until:

a) a scheme of further intrusive investigations has been carried out on site to establish the risks posed to the development by past shallow coal mining activity; and,
b) any remediation works and/or mitigation measures to address land instability arising from coal mining legacy, as may be necessary, have been implemented on site in full in order to ensure that the site is made safe and stable for the development proposed.

The intrusive site investigations and remedial works shall be carried out in accordance with authoritative UK guidance.

Condition 7 of the approved consent is coal mining related and states:</p> <p>7. No above ground development shall commence until: a) a scheme of further intrusive investigations has been carried out on site to establish the risks posed to the development by past shallow coal mining activity; and, b) any remediation works and/or mitigation measures to address land instability arising from coal mining legacy, as may be necessary, have been implemented on site in full in order to ensure that the site is made safe and stable for the development proposed.</p> <p>The intrusive site investigations and remedial works shall be carried out in accordance with authoritative UK guidance.</p> <p>In support of the applicant the applicant has submitted a factual report on the drilling and treatment of former shallow mine workings prepared by specialist contractor Van Elle, ref. We also note that Condition 7 does not require the applicant to submit written evidence for approval.</p>

Development Plan:

On 1st April 2023, Copeland Borough Council ceased to exist and was replaced by Cumberland Council as part of the Local Government Reorganisation of Cumbria.

Assessment:

Planning Condition 7

The Applicant has submitted a factual report on the drilling and treatment of former shallow mine workings prepared by specialist contractor Van Elle, ref. VE250597, dated 31st October 2025.

This report documents the drilling of 153 treatment boreholes across the proposed building footprint as per the specification into which grout treatment was attempted. Whilst drilling consistently note coal at c. 23m depth, drilling on average being extended to 25m, no



evidence of mine workings was identified. This corroborated the site investigation findings reported on by 3E Consulting in 2022, despite the recorded evidence of shallow workings on Coal Authority records.

Van Elle having undertaken the works as they state in accordance with CIRIA C758D and under a Coal Authority Permit (Ref. 30001) conclude that:

'Van Elle are satisfied that the risk from former mine workings based on the evidence gleaned from the drilling and grouting exercise is negligible, and that the development can go ahead unhindered.'

The Coal Authority have confirmed on this basis and in light of the watching brief recommended they are satisfied that the applicant has demonstrated full compliance with Planning Condition 7.

Planning Condition 7 does not expressly require the applicant to submit written evidence for approval; however, given that it has been demonstrated that the requirements of the planning condition have been met, the requirement of the planning condition can be confirmed as discharged.
