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Hi Sarah, please see a response to the planning permission as below, I would also like to chat to Samuel if he is free anytime at a convenient time and date for him or I can meet to explain on site any more details needed:

- I request clarification on whether “Plan and Elevation Drawings” shows existing, proposed or both, and specifically what the appearance is of the replacement windows (for example, are they sliding sashes or are they casements?)

The current windows are wooden windows with wooden surrounds and frames and are mostly windows that open outwards from the middle. The window is split in the middle with a wooden bar what from the outside looks sash but is open outwards on half of the window. The new windows will be the same in look and function but White UPVC. The other windows that are smaller on the front elevation which are square or rectangle bathroom windows will open outwards again but do not currently look like sash they are a single pane and will be replaced like for like. The windows will be replaced like for like just UPVC as per the building next door which has recently had the same changes done in terms of Wooden to UPVC Windows.

- I also request clarification on the doors – the appearance of the current doors and an clarification of the proposed replacement.

The current doors are a double opening from the middle outwards opening front door. Which are wooden and glass. This opens manually outwards to the property. It is currently white and green. There is 2 screens of glazing one either side of the doors which do not move or open. These doors are wooden and not DDA Compliant and in a state of disrepair.

The companies who have quoted have not provided pictures of the new look they have just provided details of the replacement.

With approval of planning, we would like to install electrical opening doors that slide open instead of open out to allow DDA Compliant access. If planning will approve white the doors will be white or can be grey depending on what the council will approve and like.
