The woodland attached to Highcroft House is made up of a mix of approximately sixty formally planted and self-seeded trees and shrubs, and has been owned and managed by the current owner since 2013. Good woodland management and diversification continues with considerable investment in terms of new tree stock and the employment of professional tree surgeons and arboriculturists. To further underpin this woodland management plan we requested Bruce Hatton to conduct an arboriculturalist review in March 2019. The purpose of the review was to: -

•Make a visible appraisal of the overall condition of the trees, identify potential hazards and establish severity, and make recommendations for remedial work. •Ensure that the duty of care is observed by the trees owners

Advise on future management of the woodland to enhance the area and improve the value for recreation, ecology and aesthetics.

5. Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

A copy of the report and recommendations is attached.

The report states that ' the majority of the larger more dominant trees are sycamore of varying quality. While this does not constitute a monoculture, it does lack aesthetic and ecological diversity.' In addition, the 15 twenty foot Betula pendula planted in 2018 do now require more sunlight to allow them to grow strongly ie additional glade space is required to aid new tree establishment.

Accordingly we are now requesting permission to carry out the following tree-works:-

- •Tree 8 Fell the Acer pseudoplatanus allow young trees to develop and diversity.
 •Tree 15 Fell the Acer pseudoplatanus poor structural form and to allow young trees to develop and diversity.
 •Tree 16 Fell the Acer pseudoplatanus allow young trees to develop and diversity.

The trees have been marked with a red dot on the attached woodland plan.

The photograph attached shows the result of the treeworks professionally carried out earlier this year under Copeland treeworks approval 4/19/2247/TPO.

We have implemented a woodland plan which seeks to enhance the existing trees and shrubbery providing a visually pleasing area for the owners and the people of St. Bees. This tree-works application centers on the dominant self-seeded Acer pseudoplatanus and is an essential step to further aesthetic and ecological diversity. Throughout this time, we have maintained the amenity that the woodland provides to the public, maintained the total number of trees at or above the 2013 level whilst increasing the species through the introduction of UK native trees.
