The Chartres range of block paving has been designed to provide a traditional, olden style look and feel that works well with period and rustic properties. When laid, these blocks provide a paved surface that looks established and in keeping with traditional and period surroundings.

The aesthetic quality of these blocks will certainly add to the looks of your property. Driveway Paving

Chartres Block Paving has been created to specifically meet the needs of domestic driveways and parking areas. The blocks provide an excellent surface for vehicle parking and the performance to match:

- Type: Pre-Cast Concrete Block
- Standard: BS EN 1338:2003
- Tensile splitting strength: 3.6 Mpa
- Abrasion: Class 1
- Resistance to weathering: Class 2
- Slip/skid resistance: Low

Garden Paving

As well as driveway application, these elegant blocks can also be used for a wide range of garden paving projects, from patios and pave seating areas through to pathways and feature surrounds.

Block Finish & Pattern

These paving blocks have a light texture surface and contain a mix of colours in their pigmentation to create a harmonious blend. The minor accent colours are designed to allow the blocks to sit next to ones where the same major colour is dominant, in a congruent manner. The mix of dominant and minor colours means the whole patchwork of blocks works in a unified, resonant tone of similar hues, without jarring contrasts.

Mixed Three Size Project Pack

Chartres Block Paving is supplied in a mixed size project pack (341 pieces) with the following dimensions and quantities:

- 250 x 150 mm Qty 110
- 150 x 150 mm Qty 154
- 100 x 150 mm Qty 77

Durable & Hard-Wearing

The pre-cast concrete driveway paving blocks are hard-wearing and long-lasting. When correctly laid, they will most likely last a lifetime, providing an excellent surface for your driveway or garden paving.

Laying Suggestions

These blocks should be laid in an unbound manner (e.g. held in place via edge restraints on a laying course of 50 mm of compacted sharp sand, sitting on a sub-base of 150 mm of compacted MOT Type 1 hardcore and jointed with kiln dried sand). Edge restraints should be concreted in place, and haunched (backfilled) with concrete to ensure the loose block paving infill is held securely within the perimeter.
