Thank you for consulting us on the above planning application.

Environment Agency position

We have no objection to the proposed milking parlour/ diary building. With reference to the National Planning Policy Framework Annex 3- Flood Risk Vulnerability Classification, the development proposals would be classified as 'Less Vulnerable'.

With reference to the Environment Agency Flood Map for Planning, this application lies within tidal Flood Zone 3, which is land defined by the planning practice guidance (PPG) as having a high probability of flooding.

The site does however benefit from the presence of raised tidal embankment and therefore is a Reduction in Risk of Flooding from Rivers and Sea form High to Low due to Defences.

A basic Flood Risk Assessment (FRA) is submitted with the application. We have reviewed the submitted FRA in so far as it relates to our remit and we consider that it is appropriate to the nature and scale of the change of use. The applicant, as owners of the existing property, will be aware of the potential flood risk and frequency. The applicant should be satisfied that the impact of any flooding will not adversely affect their proposals.

Signing up for flood warnings - advice to applicant

The applicant/future occupants should phone Floodline on 0345 988 1188 to register for

a flood warning, or visit <u>https://www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings</u>.

By getting an advanced warning it will allow protection measures to be implemented as well as evacuating people off site.

Registration to receive flood warnings is not sufficient on its own to act as an evacuation plan.
