

^{&#}x27;T1, Eucalyptus, Fell due to close proximity to garden retaining wall (less than 25mm) before damage can occur.

DISCUSSION



The Eucalyptus trees are in the mature age class and shows signs of normal health.

The trees are growing at the top of a retaining wall and the crowns are dominant within the garden.

From the Cumberland Council website, the rear of 8 Rowangate falls within the Whitehaven Hensingham Conservation Area.

We consider the work detailed in the application reasonable to prevent the trees becoming a nuisance.

T2, Eucalyptus, (probably sucker growth from T1) Reduce height by 1m and spread by 0.5m to maintain at a small size.'

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Our TEMPO assessment (below) shows a TPO is indefensible.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Inform the applicant the Council does not object to the work detailed in the notification or wait for the six-week determination period to lapse.
