'The trees are part of Crow Park Wood. Where significant groups are to be felled, the gap created will be replanted with native trees and shrubs, as per management plan.'

## **DISCUSSION**

The trees listed are in the 'early mature' to 'mature' age category. Many of the trees have structural defects and/or are causing or could cause a nuisance.

From the Cumberland Council website (<u>My Neighbourhood</u>), the site falls within the Whitehaven Town Centre Conservation Area. A Tree Preservation Order (TPO) does not protect the trees.

We consider the work detailed in the application reasonable to prevent the tree causing a nuisance.

Given their condition and situation, these trees do not warrant a TPO.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Inform the applicant they can carry out the work in the notification or wait for the sixweek determination period to lapse.
