Tree is growing against the gate stoop of croft lodge causing cracking to the wall and branches on roadside are causing obstruction to highway. Propose to fell the tree without replacement as no space for another tree as many other trees exist close by.'

#### **DISCUSSION**

The yew tree is in the mature age class and growing very close to the stone gate post. As the tree continues to grow, we expect it may cause damage the gate post.

From the Cumberland website, the site is within the Beckermet Conservation Area.

We consider the work detailed in the application reasonable to prevent the trees becoming a nuisance.

Our TEMPO assessment (page 2) shows a TPO is defensible, but given the situation, we consider it is unwarranted.
