DISCUSSION



The Poplar tree is in the mature age class and shows signs of normal vitality. The tree is growing at a raised elevation and the lowest branches to the south are close to the church roof.

From the Cumberland website, the site is within the St Bees Conservation Area.

We consider the work detailed in the application reasonable to prevent a tree causing damage.

Our TEMPO assessment (page 2) shows a TPO is defensible; however, we consider it unwarranted at this time given the detailed work specification.
