Thank you for your notification of 9 October 2025 seeking the views of the Coal Authority on the above.

The Coal Authority is a non-departmental public body sponsored by the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero. As a statutory consultee, the Coal Authority has a duty to respond to planning applications and development plans in order to protect the public and the environment in mining areas.

The Coal Authority response: Material Consideration

The application site falls marginally within the defined Development High Risk Area. However, this risk is non coal mining related and is associated with the ironstone mining legacy. We must highlight that it falls outside the remit of the Coal Authority to provide comment on mining legacy that does not relate to the extraction of coal.

For your information, our records indicate that the potential zone of influence of an off-site ironstone mine shaft (CA ref. 301514-008) extends marginally into the northern corner of the site.

Given the absence of coal mining legacy at the site, we wish to raise **no comments** in respect of this application. It is for the LPA to consider the risks posed by past ironstone mining activity as part of any wider assessment of land stability issues and local ground conditions.
