
Please find attached the wooden window spec, these will be identical to the ones on the neighbouring property, 70a Main Street, which planning was granted for in Aug 2024.

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
Good morning Louise,

Thanks for getting back to me.

I have emailed the architect (Stuart, Green swallow) to sort out no. 1

no 2. Yes wooden is not problem. I am hoping to replace all the windows in wooden sliding sash, but I have not secured funding for this, so at the moment I am just going to paint the wooden mock sash that are in.

no 3. There is one cast iron down pipe currently, it is black and round. My intension was to replace the other down pipe which is UPVC with a black round one the same as the cast one. The guttering will also be black and half round to match. I am not sure of the diameter, either 4.5 or 5. Picture below



no 4. I will ask the roofer (Younghusbands) what type/name the slates are and will let you know.
