Heritage Statement

Proposal

The proposed house resides in the Copeland conservation area and was built in the 1980s. The property is a detached bungalow which sits within it's own grounds. The property was built on an existing natural slope and has an underground room. The property is accessed through the front door on the first floor (not the ground floor). The surrounding properties were built at different times by different developers and are therefore different style properties, I.e. Houses and not bungalows. The property has no historical value with no distinctive architectural features.


