Good morning Sarah and thank you for your email below and in particular to the comments made by the Agent: **Coal Board condition.**

It would appear that the materials to be used for the proposed storage shed are rendered blockwork with a tiled roof and this is not exempt from requiring a Coal Mining Risk Assessment to be submitted in support of a planning application. We did highlight that the Coal Mining Risk Assessment submitted in support of the planning application was prepared for a new retaining wall (with plans to development to the land for residential use). However no site layout had been made available to the report authors at that time. However we considered that as the applicant's geotechnical consultants has assessed the coal mining risks at the site and stated that there is currently a risk from former coal mining activity (historic unrecorded shallow coal mining) which could impact on the safety and stability of the retaining wall and recommendations were made that intrusive ground investigation works were required within the vicinity of the 'proposed development' to determine the ground conditions and the depth of any shallow coal mine workings, we raised no objections to the proposal as we considered that the intrusive site investigations could be secured by the LPA imposing a suitably worded condition. Accordingly, as the site has been assessed by a competent person (Geo Environmental Engineering Ltd), who have identified a risk to the overall site, which requires further investigations, our initial comments dated 13 August 2024 remain unchanged.
