



# Materials: charred timber

Charred Douglas fir timber cut to size, with routed messaging then infill clear varnished.


This technique is used in architectural cladding, where structures need to be low maintenance and last for 20+ years.





People worked hard at Walkmill Colliery for over 80 years, between 1879-1961. Wagons carried thousands of tonnes of coal and coke along a small railway line that ran along here, fuelling the fires of Cumbria's west coast iron and steel industries.

*"I still remember as a child lying in bed listening to the back shift coming home – a cacophony of clogs which got louder as they approached the village laughing, joking and shouting."*

1877 - James Baird, William Fletcher and William McCowan, Moresby Coal Company, ask the Earl of Lonsdale for the right to mine coal.

1887 - Archibald Thom Senior and his family move into the mine manager's house, Moresby Parks.

1901 - William Moore, a coal hewer from Distington, is living at Pit Cottages, Walkmill, with other miners and their families.

1920 - George Curwen, Crusher Attendant, aged 18, is killed as a wheel off a wagon full of coal passes over his neck.

1961 - Miner John Kelly remembers the day the colliery shut "as if it were yesterday".

1960s - The old colliery is a playground for local children, who scale fences, explore old buildings and run across "the Black Swamp".

- Arrow down to village
- Indicate village location

## Storing it up

Walkmill Colliery needed water all the time. Water flowing from Moresby Moss powered the colliery's steam engines.



This dam is one of the few reminders there was once a colliery here. The wall across the beck collected water in ponds near the mine shafts. With no electricity until the 1960s, everything was steam-powered. So the mine needed coal and water on tap.



Eight new ponds were created between 2023-2025. This is one of them. Can you find the others?







After a lot of hard work, this beck is now a great place for nature.

This beck was once diverted through a concrete channel by the Walkmill Colliery to keep the wheels of industry turning. The beck fed four dammed-up ponds that fed water to the steam boilers powering the entire colliery. Nature doesn't like straight, solid edges. It has taken a lot of people power to get the beck here into a more natural state.
